

Here is a list of items that your child should be able to do before starting kindergarten:

Your child should be able to:

- Write at least their first name.
- Name at 12 (or more) upper case alphabet letters.
- Name at 12 (or more) lower case alphabet letters.
- Name at 6 (or more) sounds the alphabet letters make.
- Count from 0-20 (or higher).
- Recognize and write numbers 0-5.
- Count at least 5 objects.
- Name the four basic shapes: Circle, Square, Triangle, Rectangle
- Identify the colors: White, Black, Brown, Red, Yellow, Blue, Green, Orange, Purple, Pink.
- Hold a pencil correctly.
- Hold scissors correctly (thumb up).

Skills you can get a head start on for the Mountain Lion Award:

- Say my telephone number
- Say my address
- Say my birthday






Name the shapes and color them the correct color, remember to stay in the lines.
