- a. DIBELS scores 2016-2017: compared District scores to Oakcrest scores
 - i. Oakcrest: 1st grade and 3rd showed growth beginning, middle and end
 - ii. 2nd grade followed the trend of the district: scores went down MOY.
 - 2nd is identifying areas that need to be fixed. (Phonemic Awareness)
 - iii. 4th and 6th grade: percentage of students dropped in Dibels scores. Teams are looking at areas that need attention.
 - iv. 5th grade: more kids were proficient by EOY.

b. Grade Level Material (Lexia)

- i. Start(BOY): 65% below 32% in GLM(grade level material) 2% Above
- ii. Current : 53% below 40% on grade level 7% Above

 - police on October 12. City will choose how to address the issues.
 - ii. Motion to allow city member to discuss safety issues by Jill Taylor. Second by Ronnie Mulqueen.
 - b. City takes the safety issues of students seriously.
 - i. The city is considering speed tables as well as repaying the road. To save money and to make it last longer, city would rather use hot mix that needs to be done during the summer with temperatures at 50

degrees and rising. Crosswalk could be done during the school year.

- ii. Angie Nadauld suggested making an incentive to encourage students to walk to school.
 - iii. There are concerns that the speed limit sign is hidden by trees.
 - iv. Suggestions that we get flashing lights (beacons) or crosswalk at 6700 W. and Oak Vista Drive. Paint zigzag to indicate a no parking zone.
